Summary	A research technician position is available at the University of Arizona's Maricopa Agricultural Center (MAC) located in Maricopa, AZ. The successful candidate will be responsible for planning, executing, and overseeing field-based research projects centered on crop genetics and biology in arid environments with a specific focus on cotton. The emphasis of the research program is on the utilization of high-throughput phenotyping (phenomics) technologies to capture the plant's response to high temperatures and limited water availability over the course of the growing season.
	The successful candidate will be involved in using new and emerging technologies such as unmanned aerial vehicles (drones), sensors and instrumentation mounted on ground-based vehicles, custom built devices and sensor arrays, and novel handheld devices to collect detailed phenotypic data on plants grown under varying irrigation conditions. To facilitate this research, the incumbent will be responsible for all aspects of crop production and management from planting to harvest as well as processing of seed and lint for analyses. The successful candidate should be capable of setting up and implementing various instrumentation including

chlorophyll meters, leaf area meters, leaf porometers, etc.), farm machinery, and seed processing equipment. The successful candidate will modify and adapt standard procedures,

Responsibilities *Under the supervision of Dr. Duke Pauli, execute or co-execute trials and experiments as per instructions, applying appropriate judgment and discretion. This includes, but is not limited to the following:

*Conducting field research experiments at MAC, including supervision of mechanical operations, crop management, data collection, resource management, labor etc.

*Coordinating the collection, preparation, verification, and analysis of field data as well as sample preservation. This will include managing seed and sample inventory.

*Operating specialized research equipment, including regular maintenance and calibration of instrumentation and sensors, as well as machinery associated with field research and providing instruction to others on the correct use of equipment.

*Facilitating acquisition of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs, drones) and other high throughput phenotyping data.

*Organizing, supervising, and training temporary employees ensuring that priorities are set, and that work is performed safely, accurately and efficiently.
